RULES AND GENERAL INFORMATION

1. Entry fees \$15 per class, Hunter Derby \$30. All Entries must be preregistered and prepaid. Entries open August 1 and close Sept. 5. All Hunter competitors are required to enter at least one other class in their division in order to enter the stake class Derby entries must have entered another full division in order to qualify. Jumper competitors required to enter all classes in their division in order to enter the stake class.
2. Entries will be limited to 25 per class, with the exception of the Hunter Derby which may have unlimited entries. First come, first served.
3. Entry Procedure: Online entries and prepayment may be made via Horseshowtime.com. Credit card req'd. Mail-in entries accepted with check or credit card, but will be rejected if incomplete. Liability Waiver **must** be signed by all parties listed on one's entry blank and emailed to *Info@FairHillThoroughbredShow.com*. *Pls. reference horse's and rider's names. A completed entry is one in which the entry blank is filled out IN ENTIRETY, is prepaid, and accompanied by Coggins and signed Liability Waiver(s). Incomplete entries will be rejected.*
4. Current (within 12 months) negative Coggins test required for all horses entering show grounds. *Must be emailed to Info@FairHillThoroughbredShow.com. Pls. reference horse's and rider's names.*
5. Please include a completed biography form for each entered horse. Pictures welcomed. Must be received by Sept. 5 to be included in announcements. and program Must be emailed to **Info@FairHillThoroughbredShow.com**.
6. Stabling: a very limited number of stalls avail. Tack room stalls not issued unless room permits. Cost will be \$45 per stall for the weekend, occupancy may begin as of Friday, Sept. 18 at 3:00PM. Stalls must be stripped and swept when vacated. Stall reservations may be made with the online entry or if mailing entry, by using the stall reservation form. For groups of stalls , pls choose a last name to act as a label for the group. Straw bedding only, available for purchase at market price (about \$7.00/bale) **.Stall reservations close Sept. 5**
7. Please scratch/add classes at the Secretary's office.
8. Eight ribbons and other prizes awarded for each class. Championships awarded for each division. **Prize Money will be made to the Prize Money Payee indicated on the online en-**

14.No martingales permitted in under saddle classes.

15.All dogs must be on leashes, no exceptions.

16. Published prize monies are minimums; will increase with the success of our fundraising.

COVID Pandemic Rules and Procedures:

1. The show may be subject to cancellation at any time. We will make every attempt to give at least 2 weeks notice, but cancellation may not be under our control.
2. In the event of cancellation, credit card entries will remain unprocessed, and the checks accompanying mail-in entries will be destroyed.
3. If you are sick—with anything, showing any signs of any kind of illness—stay home. If you have had recent contact with anyone displaying symptoms of or diagnosed with COVID, stay home.
4. **Your health and that of your friends and loved ones is your responsibility.** To that end:
5. Maintain proper social distancing of 6 feet between people.
6. Hand sanitizer and wipes will be made available throughout the show grounds . You should also bring your own personal supply .
7. Masks are required when on the show grounds except when riding. Please bring your own masks. Failure to wear a mask will result in being asked to leave the grounds.
8. Dedicated Port-o-Pots will be available in the stabling/parking area. Please do not commingle with the trail ride competitors by using the permanent bathrooms in their barn.

Furlongs-to-Fences Division—For horses off the track less than 1 yr. Designed to give the horse just starting its 2nd career a pleasant show experience.

10. F2F Hunter Hack—W-T-C and 2 jumps at 2'

11. Adopted Horse Under Saddle—for horses that are graduates of a Thoroughbred Aftercare Alliance accredited program (see list of eligible programs at [www. TAA.org](http://www.TAA.org)). Suitability, manners, and way of going to count.

Junior/Amateur Hunter Division—to be ridden by a junior or amateur rider. Fences 2'3".

Low Open Hunter Division—open to all. Fences 2'6". A TIP division.
