RULES AND GENERAL INFORMATION

1. Entry fees \$20 per class, Hunter Derby \$40. Pre-Entries open August 1 and close Sept. 10. All Hunter competitors are required to enter at least one other class in their division in order to enter the stake class Derby entries must have entered another full division in order to qualify. Jumper competitors required to enter all classes in their division in order to enter the stake class.
2. Management reserves the right to limit entries.
3. Online entries -made via Horseshowsonline.com. . General Liability and COVID waivers included in entry, Stall reservations may also be made here. Horse Biography may be obtained from our website and emailed to info@fairhillthoroughbredshow.com (pls reference horse and rider names).
4. Mail-in or emailed entries -accepted but will be rejected if incomplete. Entry Blank, Liability waivers, Stall reservation form and horse biography form all available at www.fairhillthoroughbredshow.com. Liability Waiver **must** be signed by all parties listed on one's entry blank and emailed to Info@FairHillThoroughbredShow.com. *Pls. reference horse's and rider's names.* **A completed entry is one in which the entry blank is filled out IN ENTIRETY and is accompanied by Coggins or Coggins information and signed Liability Waiver(s). Incomplete entries will be rejected.**
5. Current (within 12 months) negative Coggins test required for all horses entering show grounds.
6. Please include a completed biography form for each entered horse. Pictures welcomed. Must be received by Sept. 10 to be included in announcements. and program Must be emailed to **Info@FairHillThoroughbredShow.com**.
7. Stabling: a very limited number of stalls avail. Tack room stalls not issued unless room permits. Cost will be \$45 per stall for the weekend, occupancy may begin as of Friday, Sept. 16 at 3:00PM. Stalls must be stripped and swept when vacated. Stall reservations may be made with the online entry or if mailing /emailing entry, by using the stall reservation form. For groups of stalls , pls choose one last name to act as a label for the group. Straw bedding only, available for purchase at market price (about \$6.00/bale) **.Stall reservations close Sept. 4**
8. Please scratch/add classes at the Secretary's office.

14. No martingales permitted in under saddle classes.
15. All dogs **must** be on leashes, no exceptions.
16. Published prize monies are minimums; will increase with the success of our fundraising.
17. The horse show will follow USEF Rules and Regulations . The horse show manager reserves the right to modify. The decision of the horse show manager is final.
18. Schooling permitted Saturday morning before 7:45. Hand-walking in the ring permitted Sunday morning before 8:15.
